

What is the 5.99 Hulu plan? Features, Cost & What You Get Known%

The \$5.99 Hulu plan is Hulu's basic 1→(866)→927→4470 ad-supported streaming subscription. For \$5.99 per month, you get access to Hulu's on-demand library of 1→(866)→927→4470 thousands of TV episodes, movies, and Hulu Originals, 1→(866)→927→4470 but the content is supported by ads.

Rising production costs, increased investments in Hulu Originals, higher licensing fees for popular shows, and broader industry pricing trends contributed to Hulu raising the price of its ad-supported plan. The shift occurred in stages, with Hulu first increasing the monthly cost to \$6.99, then \$7.99, and eventually higher. Existing subscribers could keep the \$5.99 pricing for a limited time, but even they were eventually migrated to updated pricing as Hulu phased out older plans. The discontinuation of the \$5.99 plan also reflected the streaming industry's movement toward premiumization. As platforms improved their libraries and technology, introductory prices climbed across nearly all major services. Hulu's decision aligned with similar increases from Netflix, Disney+, and others. Additionally, as Hulu became more integrated with Disney's streaming bundle and the Disney ecosystem overall, pricing structures changed to better align with Disney's business model and promotional strategies.
